Family Support Services of the Bay Area is a private, non-profit organization that provides support to parents and other caregivers of vulnerable children. The **OreMi Mentoring Program** is a preventative and strength-based mentoring project for children, ages 4-14, living in Alameda County, California who have a parent in the state or federal prison system. This program seeks to break the cycle of crime and incarceration by providing youth with one-to-one mentors, group enrichment activities, and linkages to community resources.

OreMi (meaning “my friend, mentor, someone in whom I can confide” —Yoruba)

How to Help:

The OreMi Mentoring Program is seeking caring and compassionate adult volunteers.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- At least 21 years old
- Lived in the Bay Area for a at least 6 months
- Willing to make a minimum 2 hour per week commitment for at least one year
- Must be able to obtain Criminal Record, DMV, and Child Abuse Clearance
